

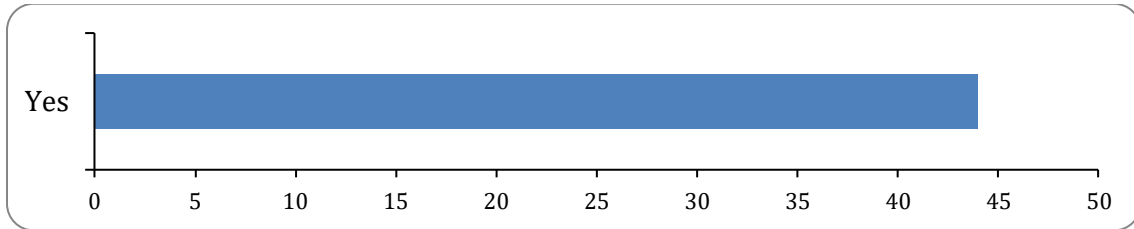
Watermans Park Play Area

Responses to this survey: **44**

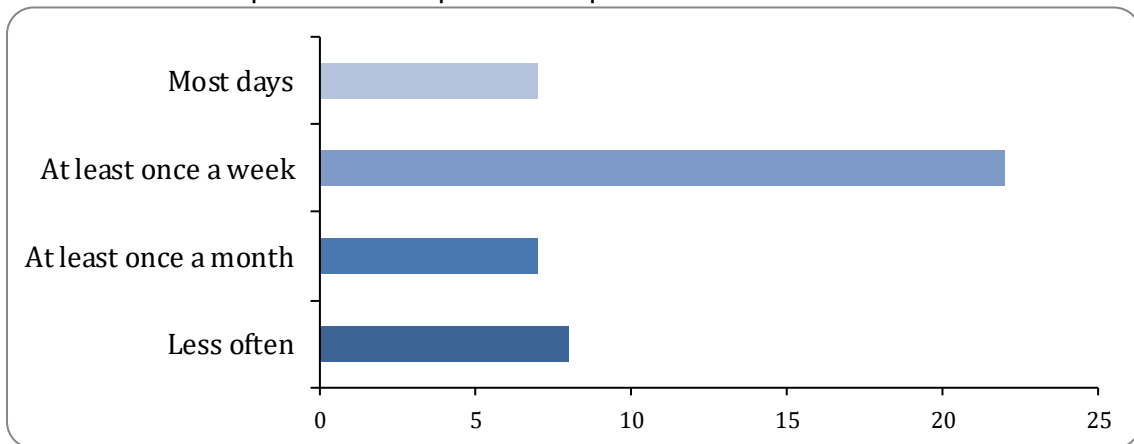
1. Do you use the play area?

There were 44 responses to this part of the question.



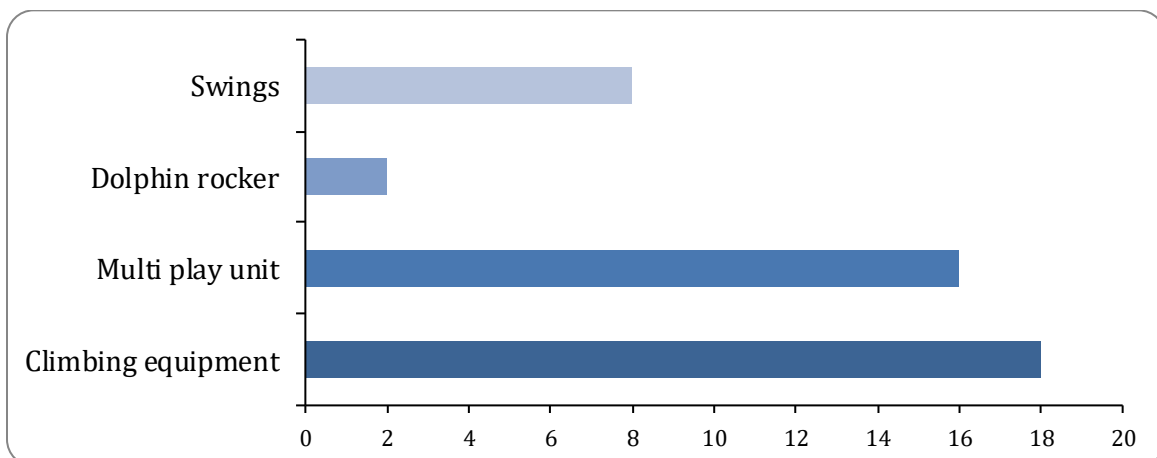
2. How often do you visit the play area?

There were 44 responses to this part of the question.



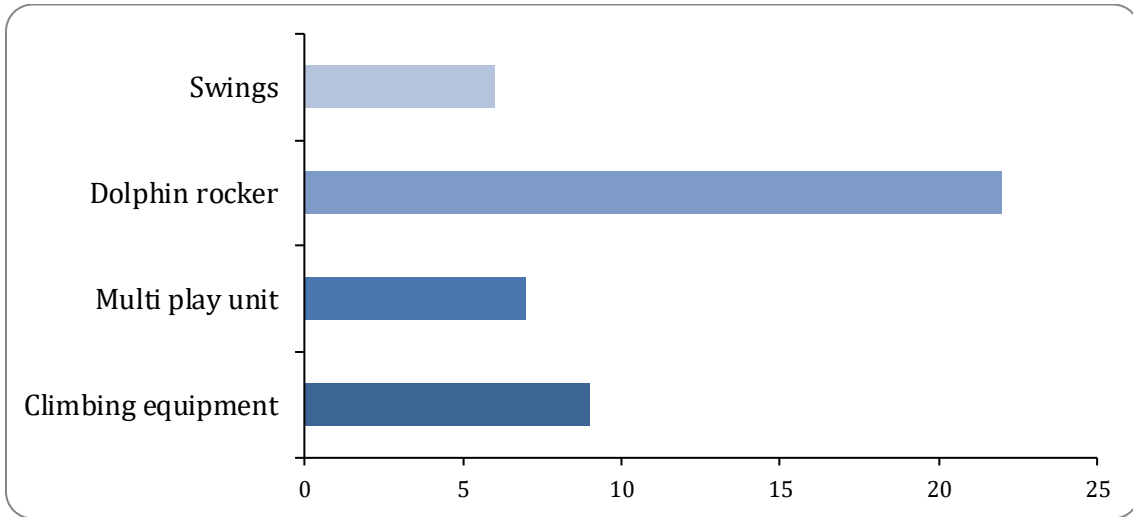
3. What is your favourite equipment in the existing play area?

There were 44 responses to this part of the question.



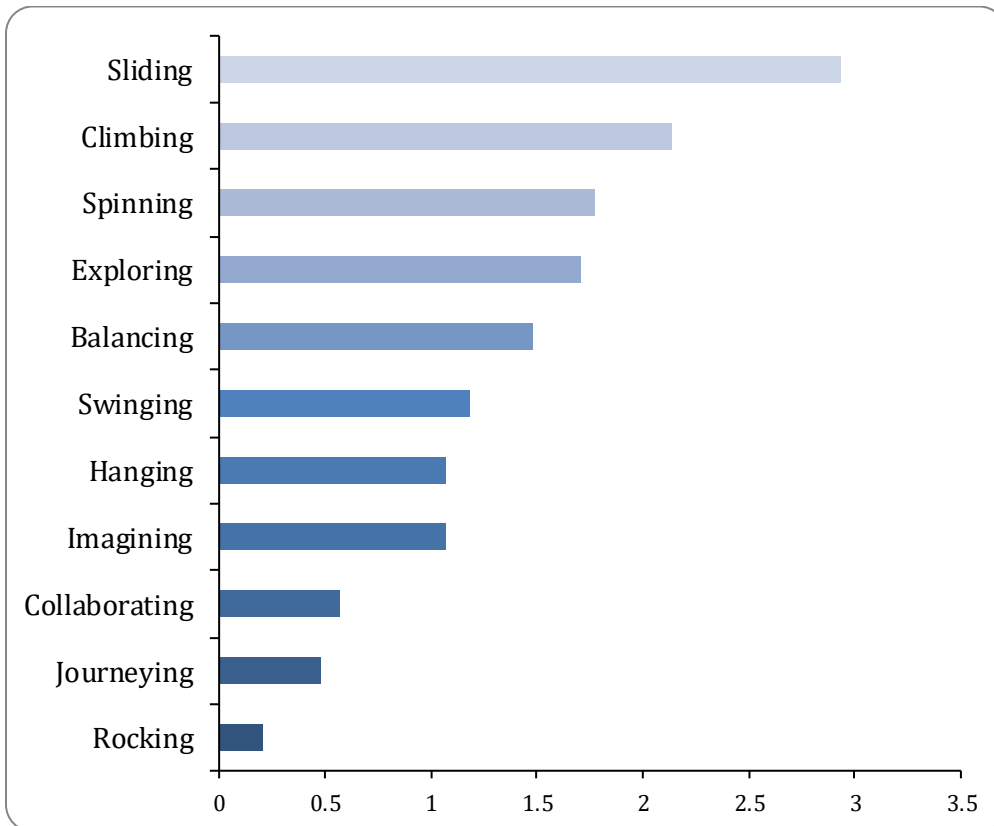
4. What is your least favourite equipment in the existing play area?

There were 44 responses to this part of the question.

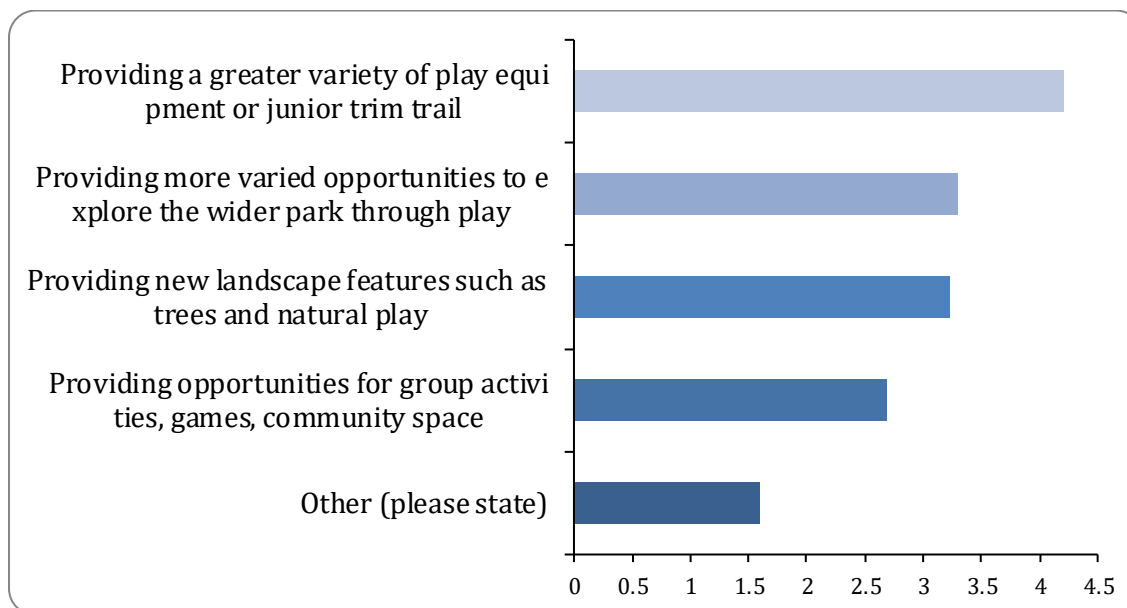


5. What types of play equipment and features would encourage you or your group to benefit from more physical activities in the park?

6. As a user of the park, what would be most important to you?



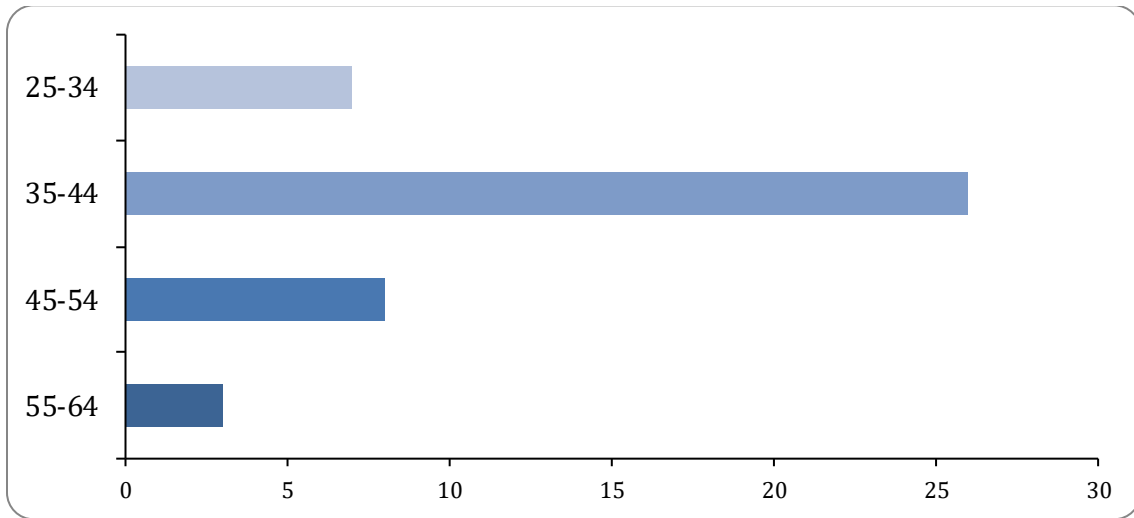
Other, please share your idea.
